Professor Sarojini Nadar is currently the Desmond Tutu Research Chair in the Faculty of Arts at the University of the Western Cape. She was formerly a Full Professor and leader of the Gender and Religion Programme at the School of Religion, Philosophy and Classics, UKZN. She has co-edited three accredited journals, is an editor of the DOHET accredited journal, *Journal of Gender and Religion in Africa*, and has had 16 chapters published in books nationally and internationally as well as 40 journal articles in national and international journals. She is a member of several international journal editorial boards including *Journal of Feminist Studies in Religion*, and *Women’s Studies International Forum*. In 2012, she was named overall Winner of the National Department of Science and Technology Distinguished Young Woman in Science Award: Human and Social Sciences.

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
